479th Training Group Combat Systems Officer Graduation

Colonel Joe Kinego, USAF (Ret), Hurlbert AFA Chapter 398 VP for the Pensacola Area, attended the 479th Flying Training Group Air Force Undergraduate Combat Systems Officer (CSO) graduation, which was held at the National Naval Aviation Museum on Naval Air Station Pensacola, on December 19, 2025. The Hurlburt AFA Chapter donates \$500 each January to the 479th FTG to be used for their awards program.

Col Kinego is congratulating 1st Lt Riffard, the #1 graduate in his CSO class. Lt Riffard will report to Seymour-Johnson AFB to begin his training as an F-15E Weapons Systems Officer (WSO).



The 479th FTG's Undergraduate CSO (UCT) program at NAS Pensacola is a pivotal part of the Air Force's training for future CSOs. This program is designed to prepare students for the complex and dynamic nature of modern warfare. Here's a summary of the key aspects of the UCT program:

- The primary syllabus includes classes on basic airmanship, weather, physiology, and navigation, as well as advanced training in weapon systems employment, electronic warfare operations, and navigation.
- During flight line training students participate in flights in a T-6B Texan II, practicing aerobatics, instrument procedures, and visual navigation.
- The advanced phase of UCT focuses on specialized training for EWOs, WSOs, Navigators, and Special Operations students, preparing them for their roles in the Air Force.

Career Development: UCT lays the foundation for a career as a CSO, equipping students with the necessary skills and mindset for success in the battlespace.

The UCT program is a testament to the Air Force's commitment to training future leaders and officers who can lead and integrate diverse technologies in combat operations.



Hurlburt Chapter Supports Wreaths Across America

Each December on National Wreaths Across America Day, the mission to Remember, Honor and Teach is carried out by coordinating wreath-laying ceremonies at more than 4,225 locations in all 50 U.S. states, at sea and abroad. Anyone who wants to offer a small gesture of gratitude for the freedoms Americans enjoy can volunteer at a wreath laying ceremony to assist in saying veteran names aloud and thanking them for their service. Volunteers across the nation play a valuable role by placing live, balsam veterans' wreaths on the headstones of our fallen heroes. For centuries, fresh evergreens have been used as a symbol of honor and have served as a living tribute renewed annually. Wreaths Across America believes the tradition represents a living memorial that honors veterans, active-duty military, and their families. When each wreath is placed the servicemember's name is said out loud, ensuring their memory lives on. This year's Wreaths Across America Day took place on December 13, 2025. On that day, more than 2 million Veterans' Wreaths were placed across Local, National and Military Cemeteries as well as Veterans' Memorials and historic sites. At each of those sites, a Wreaths Across America Location Coordinators worked throughout the year to organize and promote the ceremony, coordinate wreath delivery and manage the placement of wreaths. In addition to location coordinators, most Wreaths Across America locations rely on the assistance of community members, local businesses and civic groups and organizations to place wreaths on the day of the event. This year as in years past Chapter 398 members once again participated in the laying of wreaths at the Beale Memorial Cemetery in Fort Walton Beach.



Presentation to Pensacola High School JROTC

Colonel Joe Kinego, USAF (Ret), Hurlbert AFA Chapter 398 VP for the Pensacola Area, presented a talk to the Pensacola High School AF JROTC FL-12 cadets on Thursday, 20 November. The subject of his talk was his Air Force career and how he got into the SR-71 Blackbird program as a pilot. He stressed the importance of focusing on doing a good job in your current position as well as the importance of being recognized as a team player rather than always looking



towards your next desired job or assignment. He stressed that good things happen if you work hard and do a great job. Col Kinego also talked about the SR-71 aircraft that he flew. He brought a full

pressure suit with him to show the cadets and explain to them exactly how it worked and what it was like to fly an airplane while wearing the suit. Joe spoke to an assembly specifically for the JROTC cadets. The cadets asked many outstanding questions, and they loved seeing the pressure suit first hand! It was an overall very successful visit and the cadets and the unit senior staff were very appreciative that he took the time to come and interact with them.
